The Faculty of Law, Queen's University invites applications from suitably-qualified applicants for the following course offered during the 2017-2018 academic year.

Qualifications:

Qualifications include a Ph.D. (preferred) or LL.M., prior relevant teaching experience and relevant legal experience, or a combination of the above. The successful candidate will exhibit strong potential for outstanding teaching contributions and a commitment to pedagogical excellence. As this position will entail the teaching of one course or section of a course, together with office hours to meet with students, the incumbent will be expected to be on campus a minimum of one day a week during the teaching term. Flexibility in scheduling is required as some courses have already been scheduled.

Courses Available:

Winter term:

Law 512: Corporate Finance (lecture)

This lecture will examine the public interest and the lawyer's role in assisting an enterprise to raise money to finance its existing or proposed activities. The legal entity or entities which may be used to carry on the enterprise and raise the money, whether an individual, partnership, private corporation, public corporation, not-for-profit corporation, co-operative, trust or combination of entities, and the consideration to be given in exchange for the money, will be reviewed. Sources of money, including family, friends, community, governments, fourth pillars, angels, venture capitalists, mutual funds, pension funds, banks, insurance companies and other financial institutions, and the manner in which investments by them may be structured and regulated, will be analyzed through seminar presentations. The lecture will include both theoretical review and the application of theory to case studies. 3 credits, winter term.

Winter law classes begin on January 8, 2018 and end on April 6 with exams ending April 26, 2018.

The successful applicants will be required to teach 100% of each course or section. Anticipated enrollment in each lecture is approximately 60 – 75. In keeping with faculty policy, the faculty may exercise its discretion to cancel any course with fewer than 10 enrolled students.

Interested persons are asked to submit their application addressed to Cherie Metcalf, Associate Dean (Academic), Queen's University Faculty of Law care of Nancy Somers, Manager, Curriculum, Registration and Records at the email address below. The application should include an up-to-date C.V., a teaching dossier and the names of two referees who may be contacted.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals.
