*Queen's Law announces a PhD Fellowship in Insurance Law  
with \$35,000 in annual funding for up to three years*

Queen's Law is delighted to announce a new PhD Fellowship in Insurance Law at the Queen's University Faculty of Law.

The successful candidate will pursue doctoral studies under the supervision of Professor Erik S. Knutsen on an insurance law topic related to Professor Knutsen's SSHRC-funded research project on Canadian and comparative insurance law: *Floods, Fires, Crashes: Resolving Post-Disaster Insurance Coverage Conflicts in Canada*.

He or she will be awarded \$35,000 in funding for up to three years of the PhD program (\$30,000 scholarship plus a \$5,000 Research Assistantship).

Insurance law affects almost every Canadian through its many facets: commercial, property, liability, automobile, life, health and more. Queen's Law is proud to provide this opportunity for advanced studies in this area.

All applicants to our PhD program who propose to pursue research on insurance law will be automatically considered for this Fellowship. The deadline for applications for graduate studies at Queen's Law is February 15, 2016.
