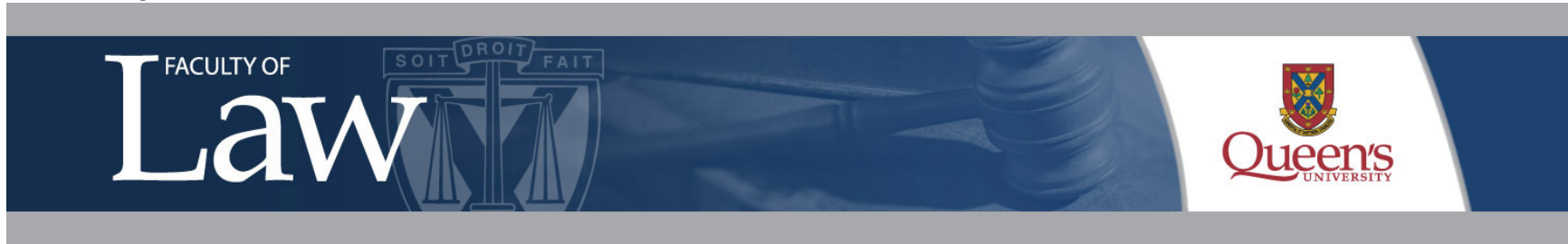


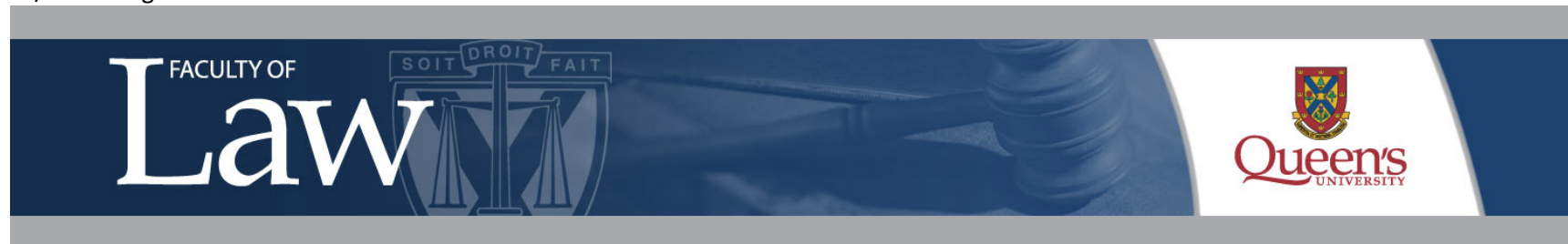

Consider advocacy requirement and/or practice skills requirement.
