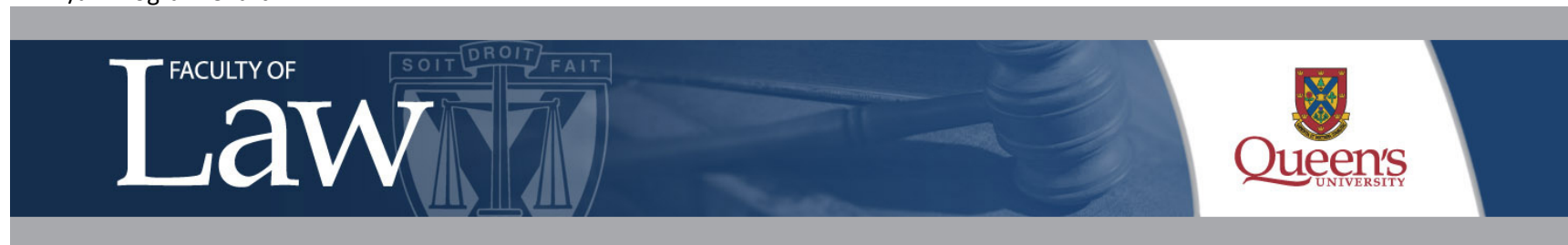

Fourth Year	JD Registration – Faculty of Law Third-Year JD	
Fall term	<p>Complete outstanding JD requirements if no early completion option chosen – Complete balance of outstanding degree requirements, remainder of upper-year JD credits to minimum total required of 59 upper-year JD credits. International Exchange is possible in this term for 15 transfer credits, if other degree requirements have been completed in year 3 and applicant is in good academic standing.</p> <p>At the Faculty Board meeting of February 1st, 2013, a motion was passed approving LAW-334 Legal Ethics and Professionalism as a mandatory upper-year course.</p>	
Winter term	<p>Degree requirements completed – no registration Convocation in June. Registration for Ontario licensing examinations in March is possible.</p>
