Queen's Law Career Development Professional Network "ProNet"

The Queen's Law Career Development Office is pleased to invite you to participate in ProNet, a resource which allows our alumni to provide invaluable careers advice and mentorship to our students.

WHAT IS PRONET?

Queen's Law Professional Network, or "ProNet," is a password-protected, online database, only accessible by Queen's Law students. It allows students to contact experienced law graduates to ask about career paths and opportunities, the realities of practising law or using a law degree in a non-legal setting, and the logistics of obtaining particular types of positions. ProNet Mentors are not expected to be a direct source of employment for students.

WHO SHOULD CONSIDER BEING A PRONET MENTOR?

We are looking for recent and more senior graduates practising in diverse areas and working in non-traditional positions, in a variety of geographic locations, who can offer insights into work in their area of law or type of employment and the processes for recruitment and career development in their field or location.

WHAT DO PRONET MENTORS DO?

Our goal is to develop a comprehensive database of many alumni with varied experiences. ProNet Mentors are only expected to provide short-term, introductory mentorship by e-mail or telephone. We anticipate the database will be used mainly by first-year students exploring a variety of career options. The number of students who contact each ProNet Mentor will vary depending on the level of student interest in the Mentor's field and location. A Mentor may specify the maximum number of students who may initiate contact each year. Mentors will be asked annually whether they wish to continue to be a Mentor.
