**Law 334 - Legal Ethics**

This introductory survey course explores legal ethics primarily by reviewing the rules of professional conduct developed by the Law Society of Ontario and the Federation of Law Societies. The principle goal of the course is to help students develop a basic framework within which to understand and analyze legal ethical issues as they are encountered by lawyers.

Applicants are required to have expertise in the field relevant to the course and excellent interpersonal skills. Candidates must be prepared to work outside the regular 9-5 work week.

Applications should include a complete and current curriculum vitae, a statement of interest and relevant experience, the names and contact details of two referees who may be contacted, and any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration.
